CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

1. ORGANIZER

VIRTUAL JUNIOR GOLF COMPETITION 2020 will be managed by a selected of individuals to form a committee whose decision in all matters relating to the event shall be final. Herein after called “the Committee”.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The Championship is open to all junior golfers who are **under 19 years of age on June 15, 2020** and similarly for their age groups. All players must be an amateur in accordance with the rules of amateur status as approved by the R&A Rules Limited and the United States Golf Association, AND have not graduated high school as of January 1, 2020 are eligible.

4. SIZE OF FIELD

The field shall be subject to Golf Clubs’ flight availability during the month. As example below we can have a minimum of 72 available participants.

5. CADDIES DURING COMPETITON

Caddies will be allowed as pergolf club regulation. The players will be required to pay caddie tips separately as recommended by the club.

6. FORMAT

The Individual competition will be conducted over the following age groups :

Boys Division:

<u>Group</u>	<u>Age</u>
Class A	15 - 18 years old
Class B	13 - 14 years old
Class C	11 - 12 years old
Class D	10 years & under

Girls Division:

<u>Group</u>	<u>Age</u>
Class A	15 - 18 years old
Class B	13 - 14 years old
Class C	11 - 12 years old
Class D	10 years & under

Note: Players will be randomly combine per flight subject to registration and first come first serve availability. The Committee may, at its absolute discretion, combine the players to play in any other group or groups.

7. MANNER OF PLAY

Either STABLEFORD or Stroke play. The committee will announce the format prior to the monthly competition.

STROKEPLAY

18 holes stroke play competition for Boys' Class A, B, C & D based on the one month schedule of play.*

18 holes stroke play competition for Girls' Class A, B, C & D based on the one month schedule of play.*

* During the month if any player wishes to play more than one round to improve his/her score (if there is available slot to play). The scoring however, will be based on the avarage score during the month. le If he plays 3 times and score 95, 100, and 85, then the score for the month will be 93.3.

For each hole there is a maximum score of “double par”. The player must pick up the ball after exceeding “double par”. This is required to maintain acceptable “Pace of Play”

STABLEFORD

Stableford is a popular scoring system in golf which awards points based upon the score at each hole after adjusting for the player's handicap

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Make par on a hole, based upon your handicap, and you get 2pts. A handicap-adjusted score of one over par is 1pt, 1 under par is 3pts, 2 under par is 4pts and so on.

Stableford is a very common scoring system in golf whereby points are awarded on each hole according to how the player does against their own handicap.

This scoring system is widespread in competitive social golf, such as on society days, but many clubs also have regular Stableford competitions as well as medal ones.

The system - albeit in modified form - has also been used on the PGA Tour for The International at Castle Pines which ran for 21 years up until 2006.

8. TEES

Boys Class A,B & C : Blue Tees (Estimation yardage : 6084 meters / 6692 yards) ,
Boys Class D : Red tees (Estimation yardage : 4970 meters / 5467 meters)

Note :

Blue tees 6084 meters / 6692 yards , Course/Slope Rating 72.9/138

Red tees 4970 meters / 5467 yards , Course/Slope Rating 72.7/132

Girls Class A, B, & C : White tees (Estimation yardage : 5.497 meters / 6047 yards

Girls Class D : Yellow tees (Estimation yardage : 4.665 meters / 5132 yards

Note :

White tees 5.497 meters / 6047 yards , Course/Slope Rating 69.8/130

Final yardage confirmation will be determined by the Committee as most suitable for the field of players and the designated golf course.

9. AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Players will be awarded and recognized based on the following :

Individual Competition :

- a. Overall Champion will be granted to the lowest score of Boys Class A, B, C & D.
- b. Overall Champion will be granted to the lowest score of Girls Class A, B, C & D.
- c. We will also grant recognition to the Champion and Runner-up Boys Classes A, B, C, D
- d. We will also grant recognition to the Champion and Runner-up Girls Classes A, B, C, D
- e. Most Improved Score will be awarded to the lowest score from all Boys and Girls Divisions. This will be based on the individual's submission of his/her BLAS (Based Line Average Score) minus the submitted final score. For the next event the winner of this award will reduce its BLAS by averaging his/ her previous BLAS and his/her winning score.
- f. Other recognition will be awarded in line with the spirit of the event during the year. Ie. Most birdies, Least number of putts, most number of saves, and etc.

In the interest of fellowship, a player who wins more than one trophy shall select the one he/she wishes to receive and shall give up the other(s) to the players(s) next in line.

10. TIES

Ties shall be decided based on a count back system as follows :

- a. Last 18 holes, if a tie still persists, then,
- b. Last 9 holes, if a tie still persists, then,
- c. Last 6 holes, if a tie still persists, then,
- d. Last 3 holes, if a tie still persists, then,
- e. Hole 18.

If a tie still persists, then the preceding 18 holes, 9 holes, 6 holes, 3 holes in that order.

11. RULES OF GOLF

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The Championship will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf approved by The R&A Rules Limited and the USGA, Additional Condition of Competition and Local Rules approved by the Organizing Committee. Disputes, if any, will be settled by the Organizing Committee, and a decision made by the Organizing Committee will be final.

12. PACE OF PLAY

The player shall play in accordance with the laid down Pace of play guidelines.

13. COMPETITION CLOSED

The championship shall be deemed to have closed when the winners have been announced by the committee at every month end.

14. DECISION

When there is no referee to give a ruling or when a referee refers a ruling to the Committee : The rulling will be given by the Committee, and The Committee’s ruling is final (rule 20.2b)

15. DISPUTES

If referee or the Committee is not available in a reasonable time to help with a Rules issue, the players must decide what to do and play on.

The player may protect his or her rights by asking for ruling in match play (seeRule 20.1b(2)) or by playing two ball in stroke play (see Rule 20.1c(3)).

16. INDEMNITY OR LIABILITIES

In signing of entry form, participant in this tournament shall testify and not hold liable to the organizer.

The Organizing committee and their staff will not be responsible for any loss damage or harm, or any form of injuries that participation of the tournament may suffer as result of their participation in this tournament.

17. MOTORIZED CARS

Unless otherwise permitted by the Committee, players shall not use automotive transportation during a stipulated round.

GOLF CART WILL BE PROVIDED FOR SPECTATORS SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY AND PRICE DISCRETION IN ACCORDANCE TO THE GOLF CLUB: APPROX. IDR 200.000,- / day (PERSONAL COST)

18. EVACUATION PLAN

If The Committee declare an immediate suspension of play, the following signal are generally used, and it is recommended that all Committee use these signal where possible :

Immediate Stop : One prolonge of the siren

Normal Stop : Three consecutive notes of the siren

Resume Play : Two short notes of siren

Tournament Director will coordinate to take players and caddies to shelter on the course for safety. The players and their caddies will be transported back to their last location on the course, while waiting for the signal for resume play.

19. INCLEMENT WEATHER

The Committee will make every effort to complete this event in its entirety (finishing 18 holes).

However, The Committee reserves the right to suspend or abandon play as necessary if weather-related circumstances require such action in line with the golf club regulation and decision. In the unlikely event the course is unplayable and abandons play or other conditions warranting such action, the Committee will follow the standard golf club rain check policy on reimbursement of playing fees.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

20. SERIOUS BREACH OF ETIQUETTE

All players should practice good etiquette as detailed out in Section 1 of the Rules of Golf. The overriding principle is that consideration should be shown to others on the course at all time. The following may be considered “serious breaches of etiquette” for this competition:

- (i) The use of mobile phones and any other similar noise making devices during play to the annoyance and distractions of other players. However, repetitive usage of a mobile phone without consideration to other players, or
- (ii) Intentionally distracting or offending fellow competitors, or
- (iii) Verbal abuse of fellow competitors / officials / staff, will be considered as unbecoming conduct (a serious breach of etiquette - Rule 1.2b).

Note : Any other “breach of etiquette” not listed above will be dealt with by the Committee on an individual basis.

PENALTY FOR SERIOUS BREACH OF ETIQUETTE: DISQUALIFICATION under Rule 1.2b

21. OTHERS

- a. Tee times and pairings will be posted on the website and announcement board at the Club House.
- b. Markers (scorer) will be assigned to the Class D players. When the situation requires, the Organizing Committee will also assign a marker (scorer) to players in other classes.
- c. Players must use caddies assigned by the host club.

22. THE COMMITTEE

In the event that the Committee is required to make any decision involving the penalty of disqualification in relation to Rule 33-7, each country whose player is involved may appoint a non-voting observer to attend.
